A simple idea for filling up some time on potentially useful military vocab is "Call my Bluff "
Select a number of obscure words including Military Terminology and give 3 definitions for each word

e.g.

Kalashnikov -

- a) *A Russian psychologist who founded a language learning methodology based on psycholinguistics*
- b) *Type of fire arm first used by the Russian Army*
- c) *An inhabitant of the Kalash valley in Pakistan/Afghanistan*

It's important to have a mix of both military and "ordinary" words and include a military definition for the "ordinary" words

Once the ball is rolling you could invite people to send in their own words+ definitions

And it's an activity that can be easily adapted to the classroom which , if it's well organised , is a lot of fun and very productive of language
